Eric was on hand to present Gina with her 2020 Volunteer of the Year Award, delayed because of COVID.

He also explained some of our options for increasing funding through the town or school ballot.

We're on the **town** ballot now; they just "collect" our funding for us. (This would also be the case with the school; neither has any say in what we do.)

There are deadlines for increasing our funding. Realistically, we're too late to do this for November, so we'd be looking at 2022 ballot.

Getting on the **school** ballot instead would allow us to tap into a larger population—people in the school district who don't live in the Town of Sharon.

That extra population would increase the funding we raise through taxes from \$43,860 (I believe) to \$52,890 without increasing taxes.

We agreed to reach out to Tony DiPace at SSCS once we've discussed this more.

Director's Report for February 2021

MVLS Directors' Council met 2/4/21 and discussed the Pandemic Response Plan due 4/1/21, a requirement for public libraries. E-magazines have been unavailable while price negotiations were ongoing. They are back. Schenectady will be back in business as the vaccination site is moving to a community college at the end of the month.

As of Monday, March 1, 2021, the 96-hour quarantine requirement for books and materials is being downgraded to a 48-hour quarantine.

Gina is now well-versed in the non-financial aspects of the annual report. With very little input from me, she has completed our section of it and run the status check. Some things are challenging to report in any year and were extremely difficult this year. We don't have a good system to track that in person program attendance and virtual programs are virtually impossible to track. Other programs (book giveaway, sled dogs) require estimating. I will try to include some in the monthly director's report. There are some hard numbers. As of this year, we have 4984 adult books, 3403 children's books, 623 audio books and 1708 DVDs. We have 616 registered resident borrowers and 176 registered non-resident borrowers. (Implications for fundraising?)

Joyce had an encounter with a homeless person who came in trying to get to Cleveland. She called the sheriff for assistance and fed the man some peanuts which was all we had on hand. Though the incident was unsettling, she handled it extremely well.

Zoom Met with Senator Oberacker on Library Advocacy Day Tuesday 2/23 along with Eric & Wade from MVLS, Kimberly and Janice from Cobleskill and Debbie Paden from Schoharie. Wade mentioned our appreciation that last years 20% cut to libraries has been restored in the budget. He also encouraged expansion of the construction amount (held at 14M) and encouraged the senator to do what he could to get librarians in the eligible for vaccine category. The senator expressed his strong support for libraries and for broadband access (mentioning that he didn't have it at his own house.) He is the ranking member of the Technology Committee. Kimberly spoke about their library as a social service. I said ourswas the primary sour of educational and entertainment materials in our community noting our lack of regular public transport and limited access to internet. Wade invited him to our 3/6 sled dog presentation.

Grants Update

Applying for \$3000 Association of Small and Rural Libraries grant "Can We Talk?" about race. The Community Library in Cobleskill, the Cherry Valley Memorial Library and Jenn Field at the Sharon Springs High School are partnering on this proposal and we have additional letters of support from community

groups. Movies featuring BIPOC and themes related to race issues will be shown at Sharon Springs and checked out at partner libraries. Each week in July and the first two weeks of August each partner library will feature the same movie. Patrons will be given free popcorn and a sheet of four questions about the movie that they can choose to fill out on site or mail in. On the third Friday of August, our regular book group will meet to discuss "White Fragility: Why It's So Hard for White People to Talk About Racism." This discussion will also be co-facilitated by a program scholar and a mediator. The proposal is under pre-submission review and I seek a vote of confidence from our board.
