3/22/24 I am planning to "teach" about the April 8 eclipse at Story Time. We will have viewing glasses and information available at the desk for patrons, as well.

SRP plans are in preliminary stage at this time. The theme this year is Adventures in the Library. I have ordered posters and a few supplies for this and am working on plans /ideas.

- Employee forms were completed and sent to Evening Star. Our payroll is all set up now. The first payroll was submitted 1/12/24 and we received checks in the mail 1/19/24.

- State Budget news: The Executive Budget supports public libraries by providing \$102.1 million of Library Aid, a \$2.5 million increase over FY2024 Enacted Budget levels, and a \$34 million for Library Construction to fund various capital projects. I addition, the Executive Budget appropriates \$3 million to ensure continued access to the New York State Electronic Library (NOVELny), a free online library of magazines, newspapers, maps, charts, research, and reference books available to all New Yorkers.
- St. Pauly's sent a letter sharing the impact our clothing shed has made over the last year...
 18,052 pounds of clothing were donated to our shed in 2023
 This was enough to clothe an estimated 3.325 people around the world
 Based on this volume of clothing, we received \$722
