Hello, directors -

I have some exciting news! For our MVLS Collaborative Program 2024, we will be doing **collectible trading cards** for every library! The incredibly talented Sam Zimmerman at the Fort Plain Free Library has been hard at work designing very cool trading cards for FTP, and we have hopped on that bandwagon for this system-wide project.

Here's how it will work: Each library will have their own trading card, featuring a picture and some brief text about their library on one side (both of these can be as factual/informational or as creative as you would like them to be). The other side of the card will have a small design as well as a QR Code that patrons can scan to see a map of the other MVLS libraries, along with their summer hours. MVLS will be providing the cards themselves, as well as various social media images and posts that you can share. Sam has been working on prototype designs for each library, but they are very early stages and we need input from you! I'll be sending out a google form for you to fill out to help us design your card, but some things to think about are: what picture would you be interested in having on your card? What would you like the text on your card to say? Is there a color theme (1 specific color) you would like for your card? Your involvement in the designing of the cards can be as much or as little as you'd like it to be - we will not be printing cards without getting your approval for what they look like, but if you'd like to be more involved in the planning of your library's card, that sounds amazing! So feel free to let me know! I am also available if you'd like to brainstorm about your card's picture/text, so please reach out if you want to bounce ideas around.

Another aspect that we were tossing around for this summer is a **community art project** - your library could have a grab-and-go art/craft kit that patrons can complete at the library, or take home and return to either your library or their home library for display. At the end of the summer, we could have a "**Virtual Art Show**" where MVLS records video of the various art displays at different libraries and then posts the video online. Maybe there is a special, limited-edition art show trading card that patrons only get when they return their art project for display? This would involve more buy-in from you all than the trading cards would, so I'd like to take folks' temperatures on this idea. **Would you be interested** in having a craft available and hosting an art display at your library? Depending on how many libraries are interested, MVLS MIGHT be able to provide money for art supplies, but that has yet to be determined. Beth has been compiling a list of low- and no-cost art project ideas that she is happy to share with folks if they'd like.

OK, that's it for my wall-of-text email! Please let me know if you are interested in this art project idea! If there's not a ton of interest, we will just focus on the trading cards for this summer, but Beth and I like the idea, so we'd love to implement it if you're in. I'm going to be reaching out to a few library staffers who expressed interest in helping out with a collaborative program, but if there's someone besides yourself at your library that you think would be a better point-person for me to contact about this, let me know and I'll loop them in!
